


# 2009 **ISOE** North American **ALARA** Symposium

Background and Objectives	2009 ISOE North American ALARA Symposium/EPRI Radiation Protection Conference is designed to meet the needs of nuclear utility professionals with responsibilities in the areas of radiation exposure control and health physics. The focus will be on all aspects of nuclear plant radiation exposure management and control, including source term reduction, health physics program design and routine operations, ALARA management, improved techniques and tools, safety and cost reduction. The conference will also provide a forum for information exchange between vendors and other members of the industry.
Who Should Attend	The workshop is directed at utility health physicists, ALARA coordinators, and RP technicians. Personnel from other plant groups that work with the source term reduction and/or ALARA programs are also encouraged to attend. Presentations will focus on the latest developments in personnel exposure reduction and radiation field control.
<b>Registration Schedule</b>	Registration will take place on Sunday from $5:30 \text{ pm} - 7:30 \text{ pm}$ in the Foyer area of the Cypress Ballroom. The Registration Desk will re-open on Monday at $7:00 \text{ am}$ and will remain open all day.
